By Bus: There are many buses that run along the Strand and Fleet Street to the Aldwych, or along High Holborn to Kingsway.

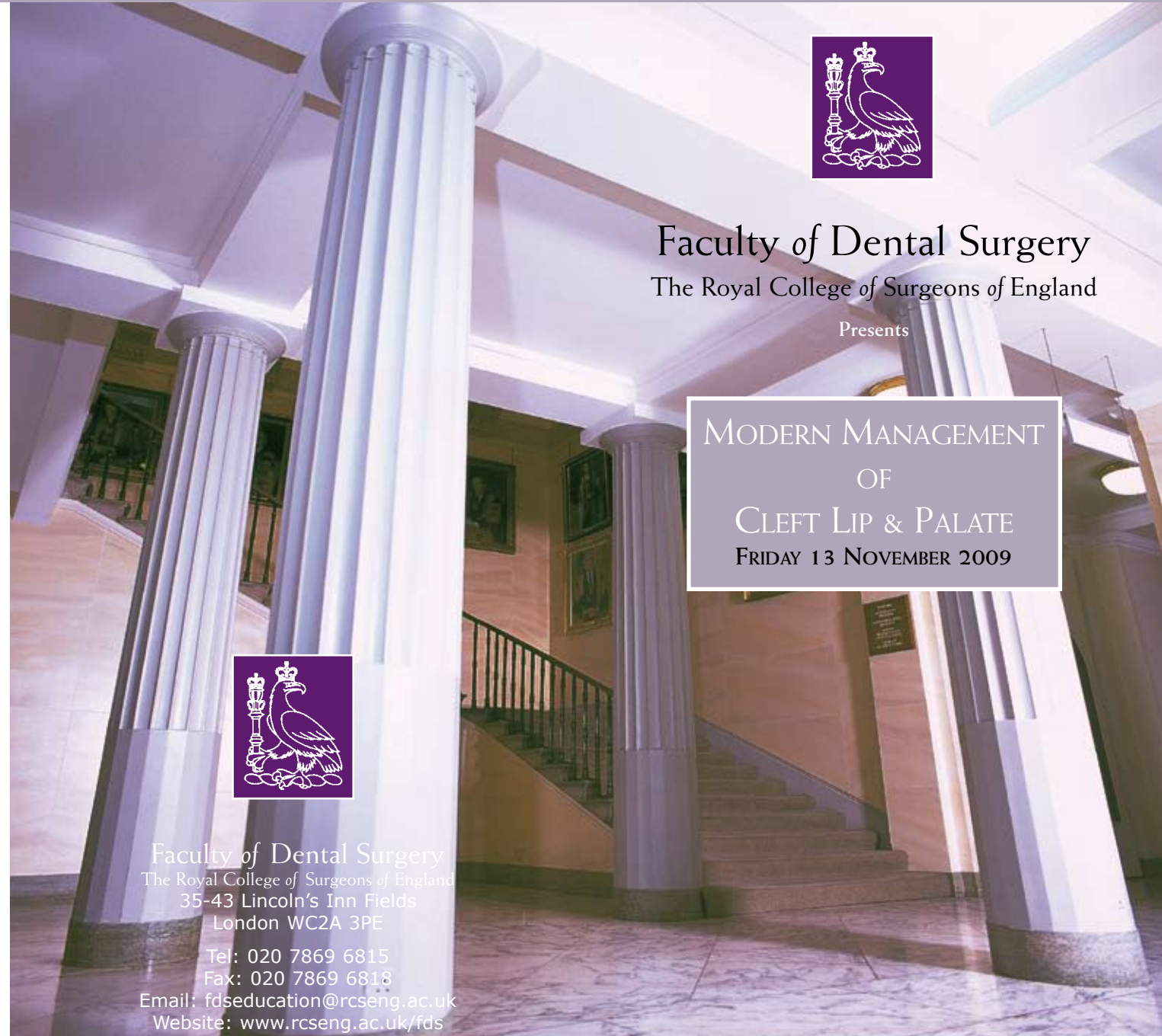
