By Bus: Numerous buses connect Tooting with central London and the surrounding area.

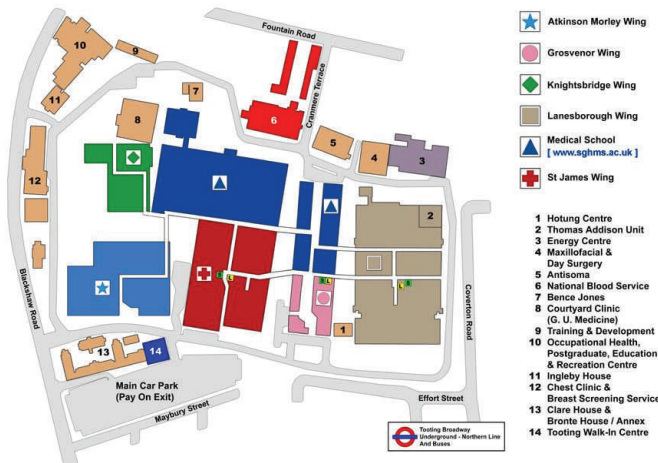
